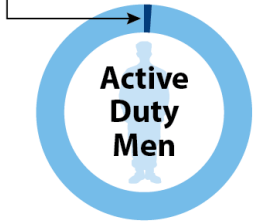


FY23 Estimated Unwanted Sexual Contact and Sexual Harassment in the Military

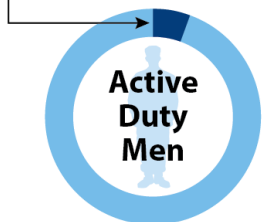
Of female Service members who indicated an experience of USC and reported it:

- An estimated 26% experienced a behavior that met legal criteria for retaliation

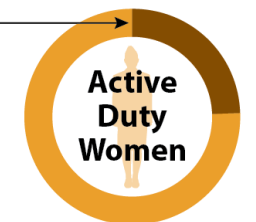

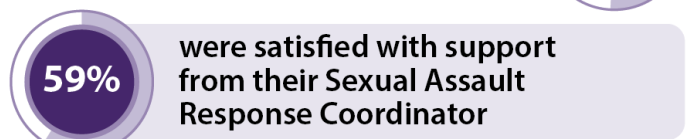
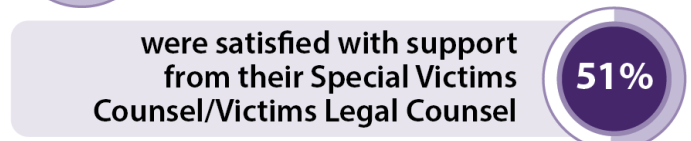
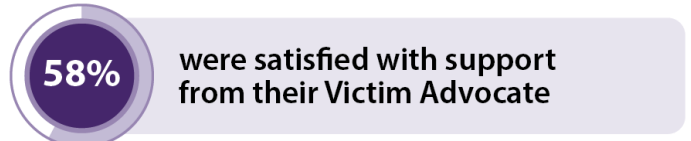

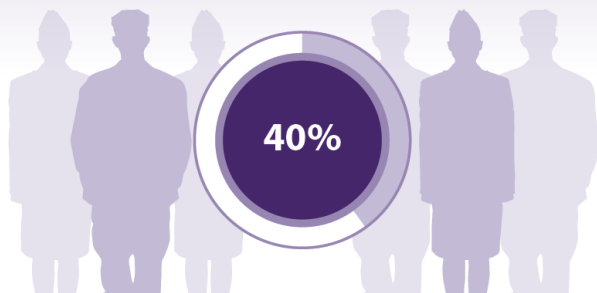
Service Members' Satisfaction with Response Resources

Alleged Sexual Assault Offenders Engage in Sexual Harassment

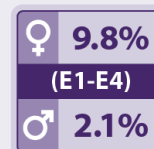
- About 40% of men and women reported that they were sexually harassed by the same alleged offender both before and after their incident of USC



Junior enlisted members and those under the age of 21 face heightened risk for USC compared to other segments of the military population.



An estimated 12.2% of active duty women and an estimated 2.0% of active duty men under the age of 21 indicated experiencing USC.



An estimated 9.8% of junior enlisted women (E1-E4) and 2.1% of junior enlisted men (E1-E4) indicated experiencing USC.
